

TYPES OF QUESTIONS

1. YES / NO QUESTIONS

Do you like chocolate?
 Yes, I do.

Is he from India?
 No, he isn't.

2. INFORMATION QUESTIONS

- Also called wh-questions.
- They need more information in the answer.
- Usually start with who, what, how, etc.
 - Who are you?
 - Where are you from?

SUBJECT AND OBJECT QUESTIONS

- > OBJECT questions are the most common. We use them when we are asking about the object of the sentence.
- What did you lose?
 I lost my <u>purse</u>.

- > SUBJECT questions ask about the subject of the sentence and are formed differently.
 - Lucy kissed John.
- Who kissed John? Lucy.

HOW ARE QUESTIONS MADE?

- 1. Invert the subject and the verb
 - Are you ok?
- 2. Add an extra verb
 - Did you go out last night?
- 3. Invert the auxiliary verb and subject
 - How did you do it?

QUESTION TAGS

Question tags turn a statement into a question. They are used to check information.

They are made using auxiliary verbs and subject pronouns. Negative ones are usually contracted.

- It's warm today, isn't it?
- I'm in charge of the food, aren't I?
- He can help, can't he?
- We aren't late, are we?
