PRESENT SIMPLE, PRESENT CONTINUOUS, ACTIVE VS PASSIVE



FORM

THE VERB BE

+ am / is / are You <u>are</u> English.

- am not / isn't / aren't You <u>aren't</u>English.

? am / is / are <u>Are</u> you English?

OTHER VERBS

+ [verb] + s/es (3rd person singular) You <u>speak</u> English.

- don't / doesn't + [verb] You <u>don't speak</u> English.

? do / does + [verb] <u>Do</u> you <u>speak</u> English?

USE

When something is generally or always true
 People need food.

2. Permanent situationsShe works in a bank.

3. Habits

• I play tennis every Tuesday.

4. Sports commentary

 $\circ\,$ He takes the ball, he runs down the wing, and he scores!

- 5. Timetable or a fixed plan (future use)
 - $\circ\,$ School begins at nine tomorrow.
- 6. Time clauses (future use)
 I won't go out until it stops raining.
- 7. First and zero conditionals
 - $\,\circ\,$ If it rains, we won't come.

SPELLING OF THE HE / SHE / IT FORM:

Most verbs just add –s to the base form of the verb
wants, eats, helps, ect.

Add –es to verbs that end in –ss, –sh, –ch, –x, and –o.
kisses, washes, watches, fixes, goes, etc.

Verbs that end in a consonant and -y change the y to -ies
 carries, flies, worries, tries, etc.

ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

We often use adverbs of frequency with Present Simple. They go before the main verb, but after the verb be. Sometimes and usually can also be used at the beginning of the end of a sentence.

0% 50% 100% never rarely hardly ever not often sometimes often usually always

- School usually starts at 7.30 AM.
- We're rarely home at the weekend.
- Sometimes we play cards.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

FORM

am / is / are + (not) + present participle (-ing form)

- + You <u>are watching TV</u>.
- You <u>aren't watching</u> TV.
- ? <u>Are you watching</u> TV.

! Some verbs cannot be used in any Continuous Tense (e.g. abstract verbs, possession verbs, emotion verbs)

USE

- 1. Actions happening at the moment of speaking
- Julie is sleeping.
- 2. Temporary situations
 - $\,\circ\,$ She's staying with her friend for a week.
- 3. Temporary or new habitsShe's swimming every morning.
- 4. Irregular or annoying habits You're forever losing your keys!
- 5. Definite future arrangements • I'm meeting my father tomorrow.

ACTIVE AND PASSIVE

ACTIVE / PASSIVE VOICE

Active voice: The professor teaches the students. subject verb object doing action receiving action

Passive voice:

The students are taught by the professor. subject verb receiving action doing action

Passive voice is used, when the thing or person doing the action is unknown or unimportant, so it is often omitted.

FORM

Present Simple: AM / IS / ARE + PAST PARTICIPLE

- Most workers <u>are paid monthly</u>.
- <u>Is service included</u> in the bill?

Present Continuous: AM / IS / ARE BEING + PAST PARTICIPLE

- This road <u>is being widened</u>.
- <u>Are you being served</u>?
