# PAST TENSES

PAST SIMPLE, PAST CONTINUOUS, PAST PERFECT



[verb] + -ed

- You called Debbie.
- You didn't call Debbie.
- Did you call Debbie?

#### irregular verbs

- You knew Debbie.
- You didn't know Debbie.
- Did you know Debbie?

## USE

- 1. Finished actions, states or habits in the past
- I went to the cinema yesterday. (finished time word)
- Leonardo painted the Mona Lisa. (general knowledge)
- I've hurt my leg. I fell off a ladder. (introduced by another event)

### 2. Actions in a story

- He went to a café. People were chatting and music was playing. He sat down and ordered a coffee.
- 3.  $2^{ND}$  conditional
- If I won the lottery, I would buy a house.



was / were + (not) + present participle

- You were studying when she called.
- You weren't studying when she called.
- Were you studying when she called?

## USE

- 1. Action that overlaps another action or time
- I was walking down the street when I met John.
- At 3 o'clock I was working.
- 2. Background of a story
  - The birds were singing, the sun was shining and in the cafés people were laughing and chatting. Amy sat down and took out her phone.
- 3. Temporary habits / Annoying habits
  - She was constantly singing.
- 4. Duration
- He was reading all afternoon.

# PAST PERFECT

SIMPLE AND CONTINUOUS

### PAST PERFECT SIMPLE

had + (not) + past participle

- You had studied English before you moved to New York.
- You hadn't studied English before you moved to New York.
- Had you studied English before you moved to New York?

### PAST PERFECT CONTINUOUS

had + (not) + been + present participle

- You had been waiting there for more than two hours when she finally arrived.
- You hadn't been waiting there for more than two hours when she finally arrived.
- Had you been waiting there for more than two hours when she finally arrived?

# USE (Simple)

- 1. A finished action before a second point in the past
- When we arrived, the film had started.
- The film (had) started before we arrived. (When we use words like before and it's clear which action happened first, Past Perfect is optional)
- 2. An action that started in the past and continued up to another action or time in the past.
- When he graduated, he had been in London for 6 years.
- 3. 3<sup>rd</sup> conditional
- She would have passed the exam if she had studied harder.

# USE (Continuous)

- 1. An action that started in the past and continued up to another action or time in the past.
- I had been working at the company for five years when I got the promotion.
- 2. An action that finished just before another one
  The pavement was wet, it had been raining.



## ACTIVE / PASSIVE

Active voice:

The professortaughtthe students.subjectverbobjectdoing actionreceiving action

Passive voice:

The students were taught by the professor. subject verb receiving action doing action

Passive voice is used, when the thing or person doing the action is unknown or unimportant, so it is often omitted.

Past Simple: WAS / WERE + PAST PARTICIPLE

• The car <u>was repaired</u> by Sam.

Past Continuous: WAS / WERE + BEING + PAST PARTICIPLE

• The customer was being helped by the salesman when the thief came into the store.
