We can use these modal verbs (also called modals of deduction, speculation or certainty) when we want to make a guess about something. The choice of verb says how sure we are.

Modal verbs, that can express probability are:

- must (positive certainty)

It's snowing, so it must be very cold outside.

- could, may, might (uncertainty / possibility)

I don't know where John is. He could have missed the train.

- can't (negative certainty)

This bill can't be right. 20\$ for two cups of coffee!

- should (positive expectation)

They should be here by now.
Past tense form: modal verb + have + past participle

Related verbs:

- be bound to
- be likely to
